### **WHAT ARE THE RISKS IN THE EVENT OF HEAVY RAINFALL AND FLOODING?**

With 1 in 4 French people living in an area at risk of flooding, heavy rainfall and flooding is the number 1 natural risk in France.

The Mediterranean basin is particularly exposed to the risk of heavy rainfall, which can lead to torrential waterflow and waterways can suddenly be overwhelmed. These so-called 'Mediterranean' episodes are linked to rising hot, humid and unstable air coming from the Mediterranean which can cause violent and sometime stationary storms, leading to rising water levels and floods.

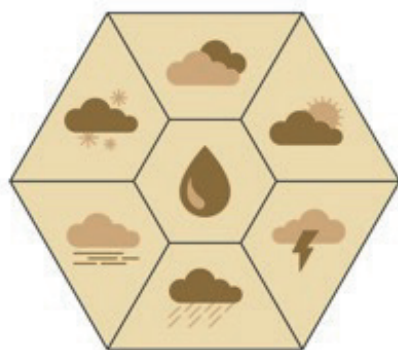
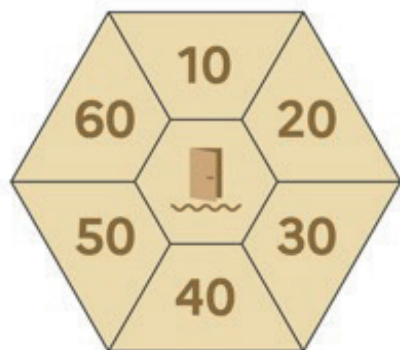
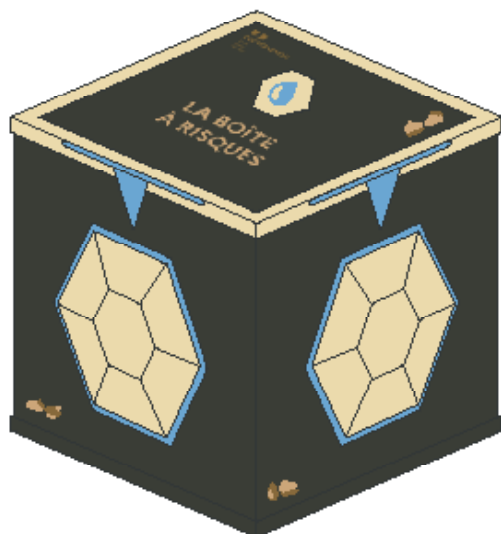
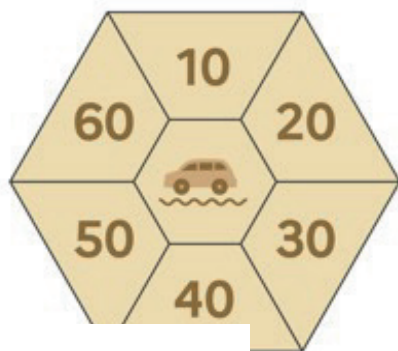
These exceptional, sudden events can take people by surprise. In these situations, adopting certain good practices can save lives. It is important to know that a car can be swept away in 30 cm of water and that a door can be blocked shut in 50 cm of water.

Locals are also strongly advised to prepare a 72-hour emergency kit with all the items you'll need. With this kit, you will be able to survive on your own while you wait for the emergency services to arrive in the event that a flood has caused power cuts, cut off gas and water supplies or blocked off roads.

To stay up-to-date with weather events, local citizens and public authorities can refer to the warnings issued by Météo-France. To issue flood warnings in advance, the Vigicrues network from the Government monitors France's main waterways, and publishes up-to-date information twice a day.
